# EDUCATIONAL DEPARTMENT

Pacific Northwest waters, and I'm sure many other areas, are commonly impacted by fog. There can be different reasons for fog to form, which means that fog can form pretty much any time of the year, and it can form unexpectedly. That's why a lot of boats in the PNW have radar. While it's generally not a good idea to cruise into fog when you have other options, including staying at the dock, radar is a tool that can help the captain greatly improve safety when visibility is impacted.

If you're like me, you have a radar, and a very basic understanding of how to use it based on watching movies and reading the manual. I've taken Advanced Marine Navigation, so I know that radar can be used for navigation, which is why it's supposed to be turned on if you have it regardless of the weather. When the weather and visibility are good it is also a great opportunity to get familiar with what things look like on your radar screen by comparing it to what you see on the water.

I've personally experienced cruising in fog and it's very disorienting. I got in that situation as a result of bad decision making on my part, and I regretted being there. Of course one option is to stop, be prepared to avoid any other boats coming, and wait for the visibility to improve. I actually reached back to flight training I received years before, which taught me to trust my instruments when poor visibility results in confusing sensory feedback. That enabled me to use my radar to identify other boats on the radar, find them in the fog with plenty of room for both of us to react and avoid collisions, while navigating using waypoints on the gps. Since then I've been more diligent about avoiding fog, but I'm confident that if I do wander into the fog I'll find my way through safely.

Everett Sail and Power Squadron, (America's Boating Club of Snohomish County) is lucky to have access to a former Puget Sound harbor pilot as well as an expert on Radar. We're working to schedule the radar class early in 2025. While we don't have a date set, it's anticipated to be run as a weekday evening class running for 6-8 weeks. I plan to be a student in that class to improve my knowledge, and I hope to see some of you join me in that class. If you're interested in joining us for the class, please reach out.
